
The Geneva Centre thus enters the second half of the year with renewed vigour to promote universal respect of human rights, and understanding and empathy between peoples and regions across the world.

8 MARCH 2021 "PATHWAYS TO AN EQUAL FUTURE: WOMEN INSPIRING CHANGE"

On the occasion of the **International Women's Day** on 8 March, the Geneva Centre for Human Rights Advancement and Global Dialogue held a virtual event to celebrate the commitment, the courage and the determination of millions of ordinary women and men who do extraordinary things in order to promote a society based on gender equality and respect for women's rights, who #ChooseToChallenge stereotypes, fight bias and broaden perceptions. Beyond this, the event aimed to honour women who are the true architects of society, to promote their empowerment for them to play a crucial role in shaping the world and in building a better future for all.



Our 8 speakers shared their experience in promoting girls' and women's leadership, as well as combatting gender-based violence, modern slavery, human trafficking and early marriages. They expanded on the significance of the right to education, the importance of childhood and the role of working with the governments for creating new policies.

The Geneva Centre conducted its first online training course on the functioning and work of the UN Human Rights Council (HRC) during 1-5 March 2021 in parallel to the 46th session of the HRC.

This five-day online training course provided participants with basic knowledge of human rights law, an overview of the Human Rights Council (HRC) its methods and mechanisms, and the differences between Human Rights Law and International Humanitarian Law.

Six Master's degree holders from Turkey, UK, Argentina, Italy, India and Ireland participated in the training which was held via Zoom videoconferencing platform.

As for the previous sessions, the Geneva Centre closely monitored the 46th session of the Human Rights Council (HRC) and shared its summary reports on its dedicated Human Rights Council 46 webpage. This 46th session, the main of the year, was held from 22 February to 23 March 2021.


STATEMENTS ON RACIAL DISCRIMINATION

On 18 March 2021, the United Nations Human Rights Council held a General Debate under Item 9 "Racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia and related forms of intolerance". Dr Umesh Palwankar, the Geneva Centre's Executive Director, delivered a statement on behalf of the Centre in which he urged "Governments and civil society to unite their efforts to enforce all rights and duties of people on the basis of their role as rights-holders, while preserving ethnic and cultural diversity."





On 10 March, the Geneva Centre also submitted a written statement to the UN Human Rights Council on the occasion of the annual debate on racial discrimination. It was another occasion for the Geneva Centre to strengthen its commitment to the fight against racism and xenophobia. The statement was made available by the United Nations on the extranet website of the 46th session of the Human Rights Council.

We attained 4,652 followers in April 2021, an increase of 150 followers since the beginning of 2021.






